Falls City Resource Center and City Hall Consolidation

Since the fall of 2024, Polk County’s Family and Community Outreach has managed the Falls City Resource Center. During these 2 years, many local residents have had the opportunity to receive vital services at no cost to them. Unfortunately, with local, state and federal budgets tightening, FCO and other partners serving at the Fall City Resource Center (FCRC) will no longer provide on-site services in Falls City. As the building was always intended to revert back to city ownership, a decision has been made to move City Hall operations to the FCRC building to keep its doors open, ready to assist with resuming services once funding returns.

As of Monday, June 1st, City Hall will be located at 200 Parry Street, Falls City, OR 97344.

Waterline Replacement Project

Phase 2 is coming soon!

This project’s new water lines work will occur on sections of Parry, Terrace, Fairview, Cameron, Mill, & 1st Streets. These waterlines will be upgraded as part of Phase 2 between July and September.



Water Conservation Tier Rate Structure

Contact City Hall with any inquiries.

The City Council has voted to enact Conservation Tier Rate Structure to encourage residents to use less water during the summer months. Based on a Water Rate study, this rate structure change should NOT affect **73%** of Falls City residents, who on average use less than 13,000 gal. per month.

5000 – 13,000 gals	13,000 – 26,000 gals	Over 26,000 gals
\$2.55 per 1000 gals	\$2.84 per 1000 gals	\$3.12 per 1000 gals

These rates will be increased 5% on July 1, 2026

On every water account the first 5,000 gallons of water is part of the monthly base cost.
