Polk County Public Safety Operating Levy #27-140 up for re-authorization on May 16th, 2023

CURRENT OPERATING LEVY FACTS

What does the levy cost?

42.5 Cents per thousand of assessed property value.

For a \$250,000 assessed value property someone would pay approximately \$106 per year

• What does the levy provide?

14 Patrol Deputies5 staff members in the Jail5 staff members in the DistrictAttorney's OfficeJuvenile detention bed rental

Why do we need to re-authorize they levy?

To protect the investment, we have all made in our Safety and to ensure continuity of crucial law enforcement services to all of Polk County, we must renew the original public safety levy before it expires.

An operating levy can only last up to 5 years. The new proposed levy will cost 49.5 cents per thousand of assessed property value.

This equates to approximately a \$17 increase per year over the previous levy with no changes in staffing.

Has the Levy worked?

Polk County is a safer community with the levy in place. Because of the levy, the Polk County Public Safety System is more effectively able to deter and prevent crime, arrest and prosecute criminals while providing a professional level of service; all the while being accountable to the people we serve.
